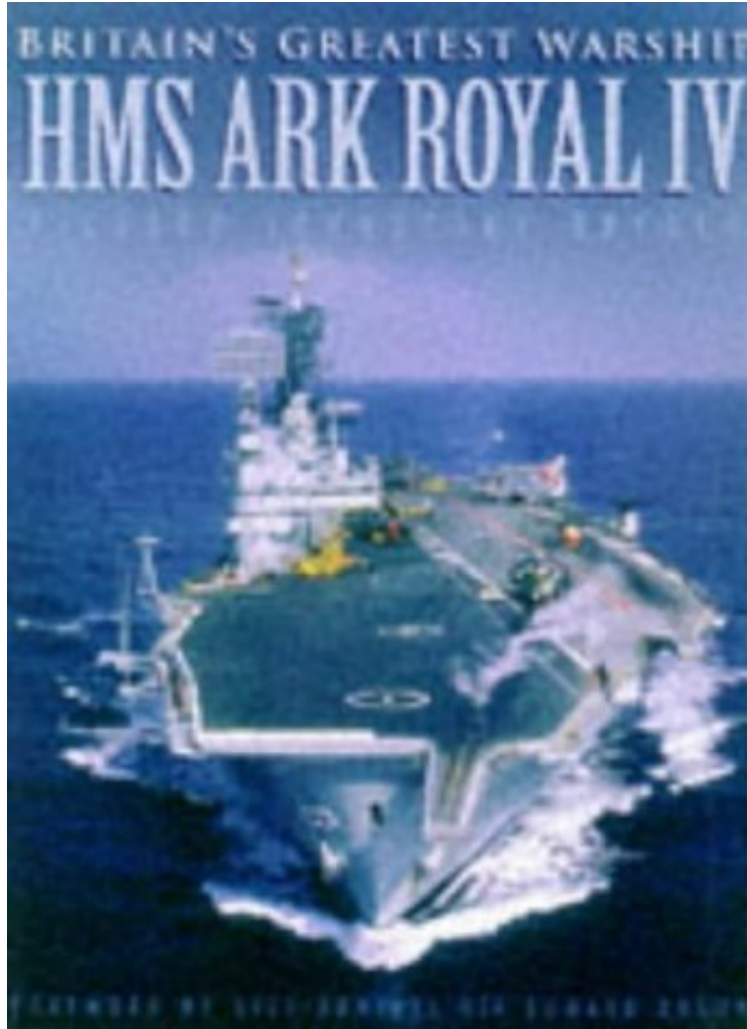

There are many personal accounts of those who served aboard which adds warmth to the narrative, perhaps some more conversations with those members from the lower decks would have rounded off the book more, it is very much written from an Officers point of view. But that being said complete with many photos (both official and from crew members) I would say this is a must have for any one who served in HMS Ark Royal IV.
