What's true?What isn't?By A CustomerWhile the book's premise is excellent and the use of eye-witness accounts laudable, the numerous typos, inconsistencies and errors make one feel unable to trust the information presented. (On page 9, we "learn" that the

battle of Vitoria occurred in 1815!) The typos are truly jolting: "filed" for field; "Moor" for Moore; "form" for from, "Sit" for Sir. And that's just in the first three pages. The author states that this book doesn't claim to be an "academic or definitive work," but it's unusual for a work on this subject (and at this price! - \$35 at the bookstore) to be so poorly presented.
