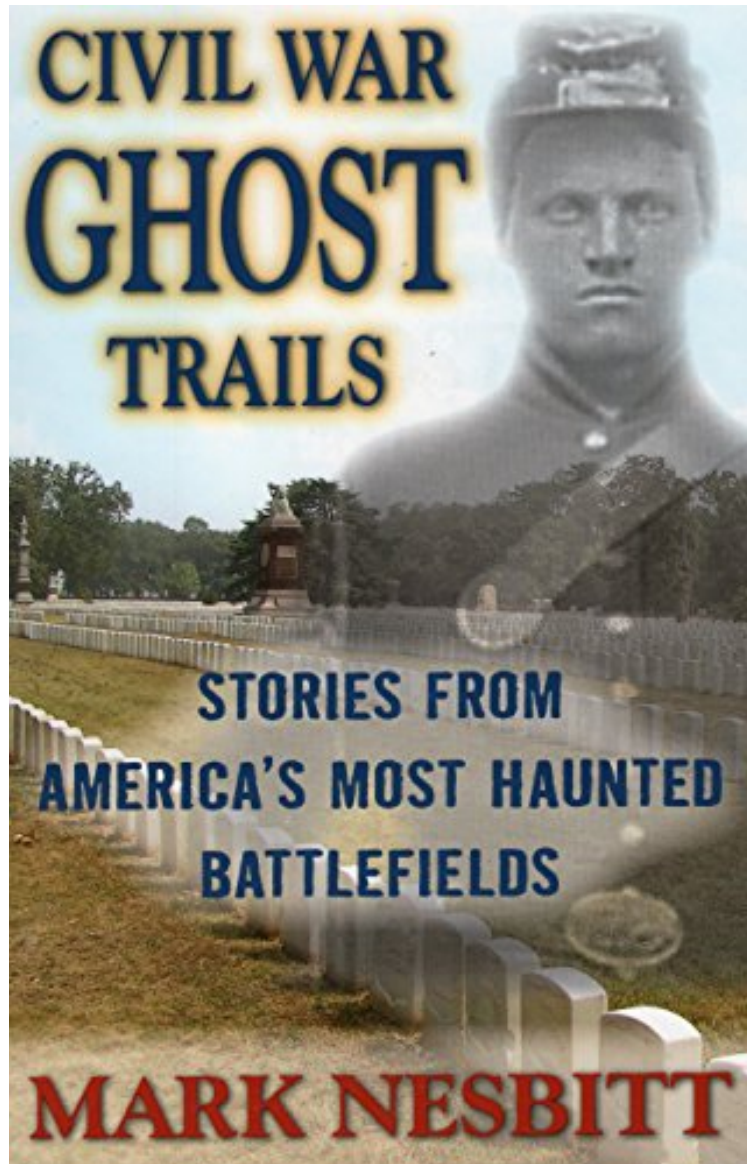

Instead of just writing about experiences people have had when visiting or working at the battlefield sites, Mr. Nesbitt gives a comprehensive history of what transpired during the war. From battle tactics to intense details of the conditions the soldiers experienced, you are transported back to understand why many believe there are souls that could not or would not leave. Mr. Nesbitt is best known for his series of "Ghosts of Gettysburg" books, and does include a story or two about that battlefield - but so many other sites are covered in this book. Antietam, Wilderness, Cold Harbor, Fredericksburg, and many many more. Mark Nesbitt combines both in this fascinating period of history. He goes through all the major battles (and then some!) and how they contributed to hauntings today. The author is obviously very well versed in both Civil War history and ghostlore, and along with articulately talking about the ghosts, he also very clearly outlines the battles, focusing not only on the facts but also the emotional tolls these battles put on the combatants.
