These intimate narratives relate both the horrors of the conflict and the loyalty of the young men, many of them recent arrivals from Norway, to what they consistently refer to as "our new fatherland". When he produced the book in 1916, Ager wished to convey to a generation of Norwegian-Americans the significant contribution that their recent ancestors had made to American history. This new translation passes those stories along to their grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and beyond.
