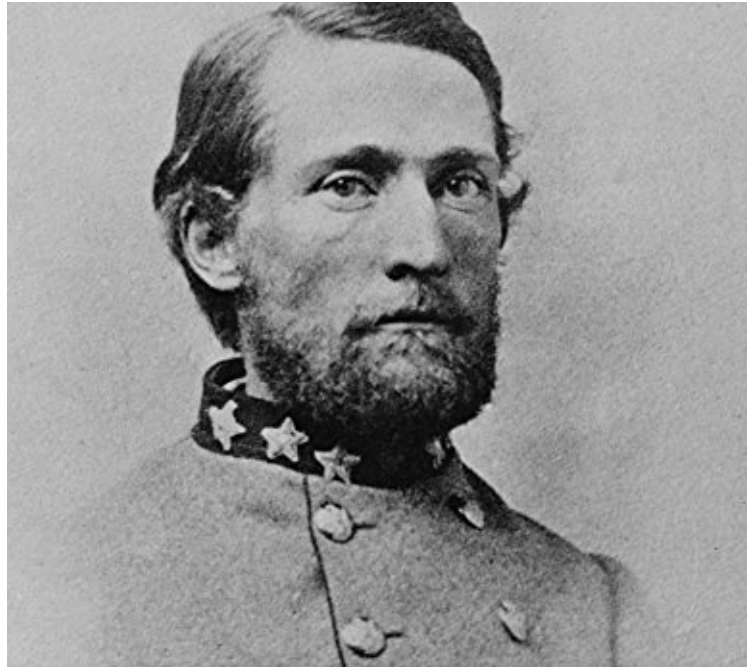

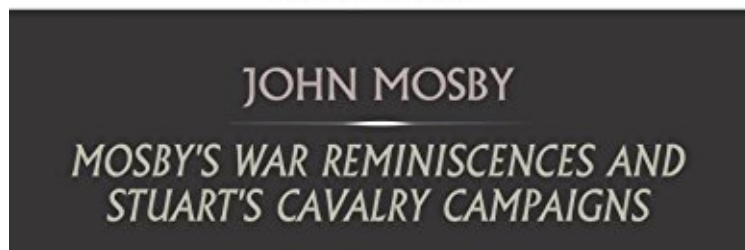

His claim "we were in uniform and it was war" (not an exact quote) seems justified and I suspect his tactics have been studied and used by many fighters of guerrilla wars since. Complaints he was countering sound very much like the British after their retreat from Concord; "The cowards hid behind trees and other cover instead of standing and fighting us like Men!" Mosby seems to have enjoyed the general support of the countryside in which he fought, always key in guerrilla war. Mosby himself, it's well-hidden. Chronologically, he jumps all over the place, one time talking about Lee's journey to Gettysburg, then in the next page discussing the Battle of 1st Manassas. In the very beginning he starts off as a private soldier, then somehow, with no explanation how, he's leading his own cavalry unit. The narrative is disjointed and at times hard to follow. If you can get past that, however, it's a pretty good read. The ending comes with no warning, though. You get to the end of a paragraph, and that's it! There is no more!

About the Author John Singleton Mosby, the Gray Ghost, was a Confederate colonel and cavalry commander during the American Civil War (1861-1865.) As a young man, Mosby developed an interest in the law as the result of serving time for the unlawful shooting of a local tavern-owner's son, and eventually established his own law practice in Virginia. Although an opponent of both slavery and the secessionist movement, Mosby joined the Confederate army at the outbreak of war in 1861, and was eventually given command of a cavalry battalion in 1863. Known as Mosby's Rangers or Mosby's Raiders, the battalion operated in an area of northern central Virginia that came to be known as Mosby's Confederacy. Following the war, Mosby returned to the law, and eventually served in the U. S. Department of Justice. Mosby died in 1916.
