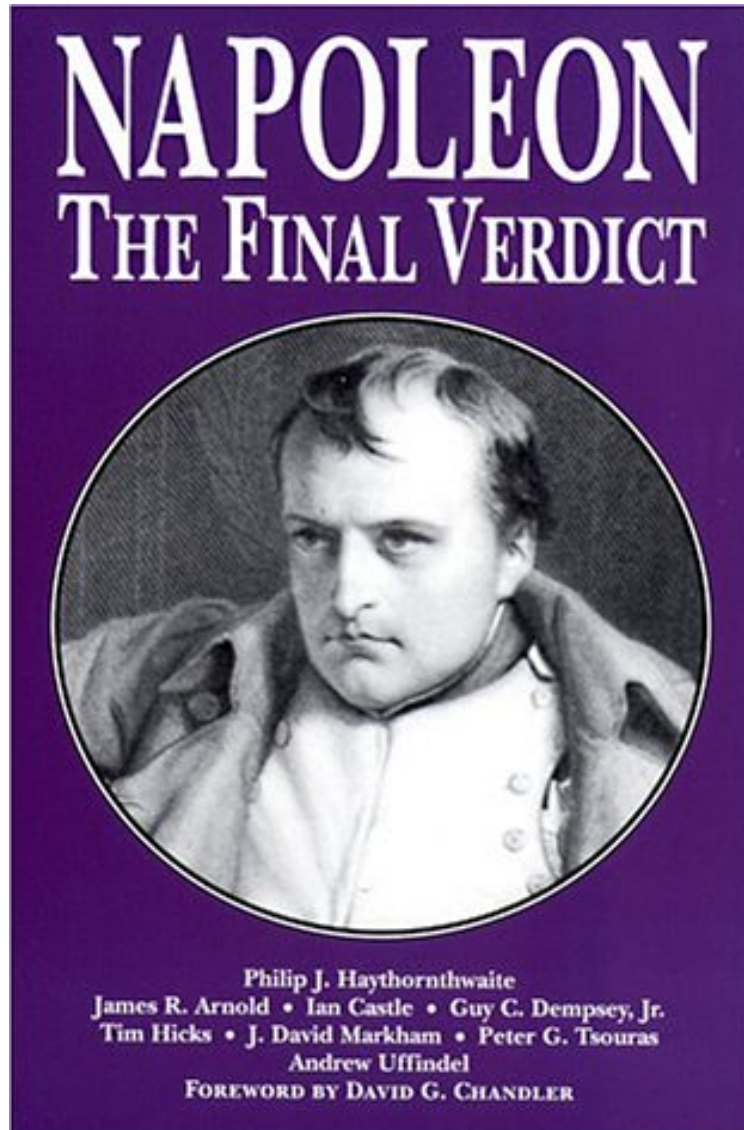

Although it lacked extensive details on individual battles, it gave basic knowledge necessary to understand the Napoleonic Wars. The book is divided into two sections. The first section gives the knowledge obtained on his life. The second section analyzes the information given in the first to help you determine Napoleon's true quality. I especially like the pages of quotes which the author has included in the back of the book.

The first part of the book is made up of a series of reports on the military actions, from his earliest commands to his death on St Helena. This is followed by studies on his motivational abilities, his tactical strengths and weaknesses, comparison of him with the enemies he fought and a summary of the words and sayings he left behind.
