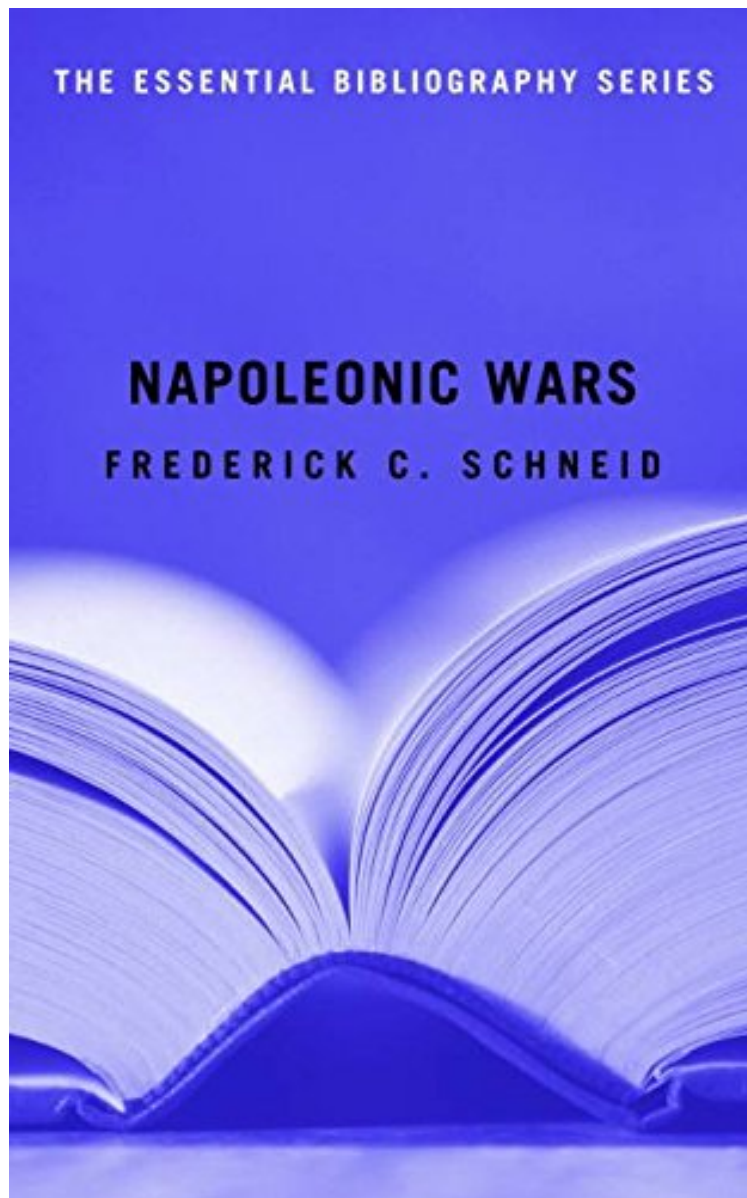

Fills a needBy JKWith so many books on Napoleon, Schneid's little guide is very useful to anyone trying to identify the seminal works, but who is boggled by the millions of titles that range from classic, fully-sourced works of scholarship to uniform coloring books. The content is arranged by categories of interest (origins, general histories, campaign descriptions, and peripheral subjects). Until relatively recently, the works in English tilted unsurprisingly toward an emphasis on French and English perspectives, so some of the newer publications restore some balance by reference to Russian and German sources.0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
