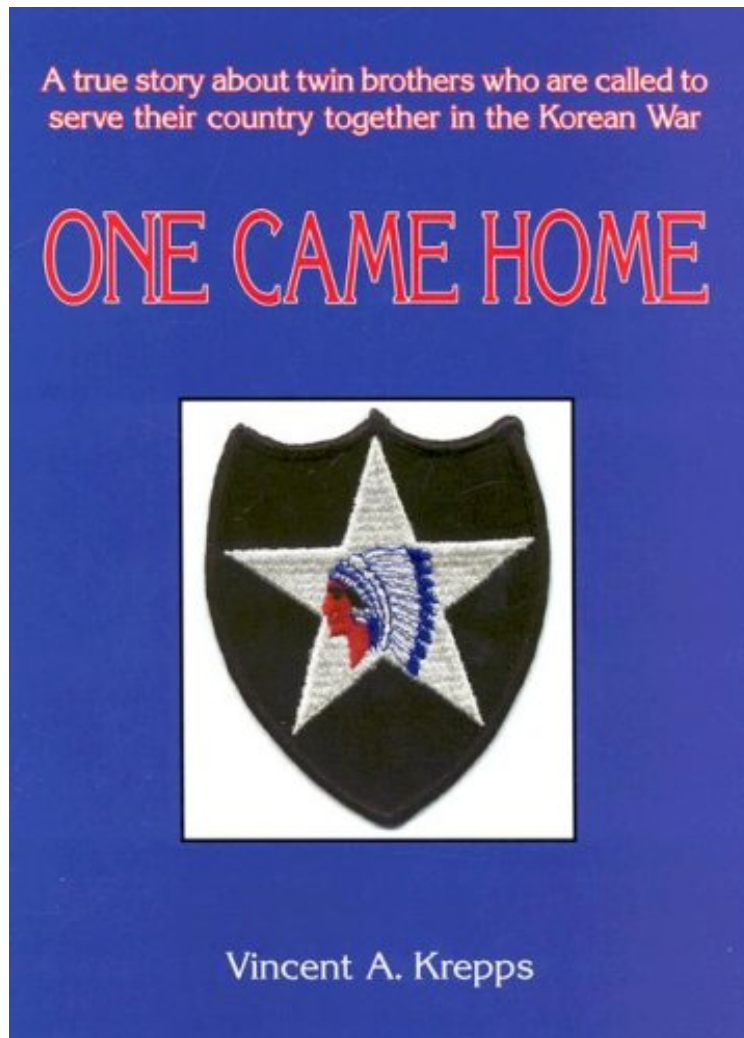

Having earned a Silver Star for bravery, Vincent writes with a very special authority of his efforts to recover American POW's and MIA's from the Korean War (including his brother Richard).
