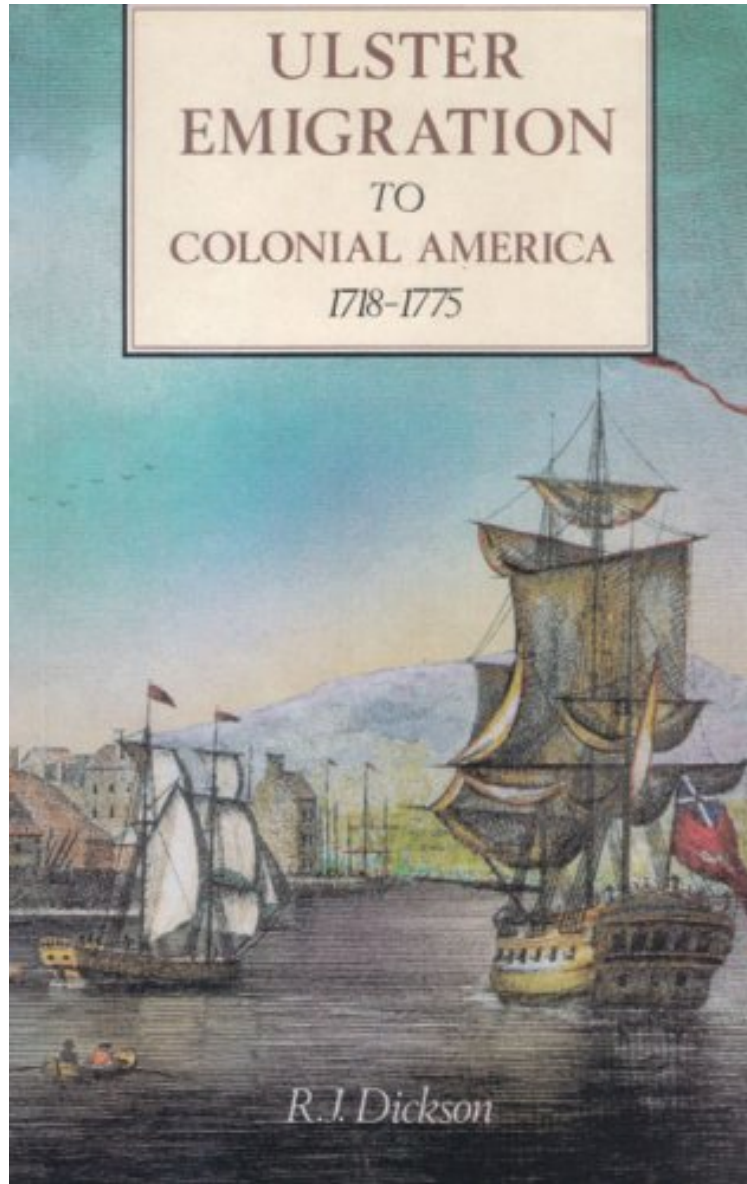

Shepherd This is the scholarly standard study regarding eighteenth century immigration, prior to the American Revolution, of thousands of people of mostly Scottish background and Protestant religion from Ulster to North America. A detailed examination of the economic, social, and political background is included as well as information on the background and motivations of the immigrants. A primary focus is the impact of the rents, prices, and wages as incentives to emigrate.

First published in 1966, R.J. Dickson's *Ulster Emigration to Colonial America 1718-1775* remains the acknowledged work of scholarship on migration in the 18th century of a quarter of a million people from Ulster to the New World. It combines detailed investigation of the economic, social and political background to the exodus with information on the emigrant trade and an analysis of the motivations and origins of the emigrants themselves. This new edition includes a specially written Introduction by Graeme Kirkham, whose researches on both sides of the Atlantic are reflected in an essay which considers recent advances in the understanding of this important mass population movement from Ireland to America.
